**1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER**

Mayor Noble called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

**2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The Stillwater City Council led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**3. PROCLAMATIONS & PRESENTATIONS**

- a. May is Bike Month

Councilor Zannotti proclaimed the month of May 2016 in the City of Stillwater as "*National Bike Month and Bicycle Safety Month*" and the week of May 16-20, 2016 as "*Bike to Work Week*" with the annual *Bike to Work Day* being held on May 20, as well as a *Ride of Silence* on May 18. Mary Cash, representing the Red Dirt Pedalers, accepted the proclamation and shared activities that would be occurring during the month of May.

## **5. PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS NOT SCHEDULED FOR PUBLIC HEARING**

There were no public comments on agenda items not scheduled for public hearing.

## **6. ITEMS REMOVED FROM THE CONSENT DOCKET**

## **7. GENERAL ORDERS**

- a. Consider possible City financial participation in upgrade/enhancement of public infrastructure improvements for projects located at: (CC-16-56)
  - i. Trittenbach – The east half of the 800 block of 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue extending south approximately 502 feet and the 700 block between Hester and Ramsey approximately south of 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue and extending south approximately 206 feet
  - ii. Inscore – 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Hester & Ramsey Streets extending south to approximately 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue

City Manager McNickle stated that staff would like to have a policy developed, but it would be very difficult with so many different components to the developments in Form Based Codes. Mr. McNickle explained that the above referenced developments are ready to begin.

Development Services Director Paula Dennison reported that the topic would be the relationship between the private property and the public realm of Form-Based Codes (FBC). Two developments are currently being proposed for the area on the south side of 4<sup>th</sup> and between Hester and Washington Streets. Ms. Dennison explained that the responsibility of constructing the public realm, the area immediately adjacent to their development, to FBC standards lies with the developers; however, staff has looked at the benefits to participating with these developers to complete the public realm.

Ms. Dennison presented staff's short-term recommendations regarding the two active developments proposals, with staff recommending fee waivers for the Trittenbach and Inscore Developments with the following criteria:

- Developer constructs full width right-of-way public realm improvements for 4<sup>th</sup> from Washington through Hester, Hester from 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>, and Ramsey from 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>;
- Developer constructs full block length public realm improvements of 4<sup>th</sup> from Washington through Hester, Hester from 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>, and Ramsey from 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>; and
- Developer signs an agreement to not protest any future assessment district.

Ms. Dennison presented a cost matrix showing the estimated values for each level of participation in the development of the public realm:

Ms. Dennison reported that participation by the City, in the waiving of fees, demonstrates the desire for high-density student housing to locate in this area of Stillwater and the return on the investment by the City is approximately 35% as the developers will be constructing valuable public infrastructure. Chief Financial Officer Melissa Reames explained how the “Return on Investment” (ROI) percentages were attained.

Discussion occurred regarding:

- Extent of the fees to be waived
- Value of the portion of Ramsey Street shared by both developers
- Applicability of City zoning on Oklahoma State University
- Scope of public realm work by the developers
- Possible expectations by the developers for reimbursement once the project is complete
- Value of full width/full block improvements for the City
- Value of partnerships with the developers
- Methods the City could use to recoup its costs, if fees are waived
- Status of the two developments
- Formation of development agreements with the developers
- Types of fees collected by Development Services
- Policy for the City’s financial participation in upgrade/enhancement of public infrastructure improvements in the FBC area

John Bartley, 623 S. Lewis, representing Trittenbach, in response to Mayor Noble’s question, stated Trittenbach was not giving the City of Stillwater the money and the fee waiver is not an incentive, but a financing method for the City to get the extra work completed.

Kelly Harris, Keystone Engineering, engineer for Trittenbach and TR Inscore, stated that this is similar to how upsizing water lines are currently handled between the City and developers.

Staff recommended the waiver of fees for TR Inscore development and for Trittenbach development subject to full width, full block public realm construction and agreement to non-protest of future assessment district; and to direct staff to prepare long-term action items with recommendation to City Council.

Ms. Dennison stated that alternatives are to accept recommendation; do not waive fees and direct staff to bring back long-term financial participation options for the area; and choose to not participate financially by any means.

**MOTION BY COUNCILOR NAJERA, SECOND BY COUNCILOR JOYCE TO NOT WAIVE FEES FOR TR INSCORE DEVELOPMENT OR FOR TRITTENBACH DEVELOPMENT AND DIRECT STAFF TO BRING BACK LONG-TERM FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION OPTIONS FOR THE FORMED-BASED CODES AREA.**

**ROLL CALL VOTE: NOBLE-YEA, DARLINGTON-YEA, NAJERA-YEA, ZANNOTTI-NAY, JOYCE-YEA. MOTION CARRIED WITH FOUR YEA VOTES.**

b. Water 2040 Package B Resolution of Reimbursement (CC-16-53)

Water Resources Director Bill Millis presented a summary of the status of Packages A, B and C of Water 2040. Mr. Millis stated that the first Package B project bid is scheduled for March 2017; and the loan application for Package B will be prepared and submitted later this year. In order to be reimbursed for certain project costs that are incurred prior to the Package B loan closing, a Resolution of Reimbursement must be passed by the Trustees. The Resolution provides for reimbursement of certain hard costs related to physical items. Soft costs are also reimbursable through the loan, but are not required to be listed in the Resolution.

No action was required at this point and staff recommended that Trustees approve the Resolution of Reimbursement for Water 2040 Package B under the Resolutions portion of the agenda.
