Background / Issue:	<p>In FY 18, the City Council began a concentrated effort to improve pavement markings across the community. The FY 19 budget continued that effort.</p> <p>Plans and specifications are developed for pavement marking at various locations throughout the City. A bid request was released for approximately 25 miles of roadway pavement markings. Proposal/Solution:	<p>The following options are available to the Council:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Award a contract in the amount not to exceed \$325,177 to Action Safety Supply and authorize the City Manager to sign the contract 2. Reject all bids and either rebid the project or complete no pavement markings. <p>The difference between the bid amount and contract amount will be used for contingency.</p>						
Financial Impact/Funding Source(s):	FY 2019 budget includes \$325,177 for street markings and is being recommended to the City Council on a future agenda for re-appropriation in FY20 for this purpose.
