



The following guidelines are provided to aid bars and restaurants in establishing their Temporary Outdoor Expansion service areas. In order to provide separation from the vehicular roadway, certain safety and visual items are required.

All Temporary Outdoor Expansion service areas shall be separated from the vehicular roadway by:

- Water fillable jersey-type barriers;
- Shipping containers;
- Parking stops;
- Solid barriers, including planter boxes;
- Decorative fencing and vegetative materials/shade structure; or
- Any combination of the above.

Materials used for separation from vehicular roadway shall not be attached to the street, sidewalk, or curb with bolts, flanges, spikes, or any other method that damages the public way.

Each Temporary Outdoor Expansion service area shall only use solar or propane powered lighting, heating appliance or cooling appliance.

Dining areas and pedestrian pathways must be ADA accessible.

When the sidewalk is utilized as part of the Temporary Outdoor Expansion service area, a separate pedestrian pathway must be provided:

- Minimum 5-foot wide pathway, and
- Minimum 1-foot separation by solid planters or decorative fencing/vegetation material from vehicular roadway.
